Learn about slavery and the Underground Railroad. Discover why the Underground Railroad in Michigan was so well traveled. Make some crafts, explore our Underground Railroad exhibit, and tour the Silverbrook Cemetery.

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Juniors **FINDING YOUR WAY** *Juniors*

Explore maps of the past. Learn how the French found their way around the area that is now Michigan. Create a map and find your way North, South, East or West. Plus additional activities.

Juniors **FOLK ARTS** *Juniors*

Learn an art form that was traditional for girls many years ago. Do a folk art project, explore toys from the past and go on a History Hunt throughout the museum.

Brownies **SCIENCE IN ACTION** *Brownies*

Brownies **Underground Railroad Program** *Juniors*

Learn the history of the Underground Railroad. What was it? When did it start? Examine the words to "Follow the Drinking Gourd" explore the routes that fugitive slaves took and learn why Michigan was such a well traveled state.
